### Summary

Isaiah Berlin is mostly known for his defence of value pluralism and also for being a liberal, but the theoretical connection between his pluralism and his liberalism is far from self-evident, and has been widely disputed among political philosophers. This article highlights the tension within Berlin's thesis of value pluralism and examines the responses of contemporary liberals to the problem of value conflicts. The author concludes by suggesting the possibility and necessity of recasting the issue of value conflicts in anti-foundationalist terms.
